It's a pleasure to present the selected works for the 2012 Be Part Miami benefit supporting the Fundación Ayuda a la Infancia Hogares Bambi. The art and artists featured here represent Colombia's current art scene.

The works of each of these artists were carefully selected to provide Miami collectors with a varied, high-quality sample. Our aim was to include a balanced variety of techniques including photography, drawing, sculpture, painting and mixed techniques, and to feature artists with different tendencies, of different ages and from different parts of Colombia in a representative offering of Colombia's recent artistic production.

Finally, we have included works from a younger generation to provide a glimpse of the power and intensity of new tendencies apparent in pieces by artists such as Natalia Castañeda, Esteban Peña, Nicolás Cárdenas, Nohemí Pérez, Máximo Flórez, Diana Drews, Catalina Ortiz, Claudia Hakim, Saúl Sánchez, María Isabel Rueda, Jaime Tarazona, Max Steven Grossman and Miler Lagos.

We are delighted to support Be Part, Miami 2012 and are pleased that our work can contribute significantly to those who benefit from the wonderful work done by Fundación Ayuda a la Infancia Hogares Bambi in Colombia.

From a series of photographs taken of the emblematic Puerto Colombia wharf in Colombia's Atlantico department, now destroyed by prolonged deterioration. This piece is one of the last visual testimonies of the place.

This piece is part of an extensive work created in 1990 in which Cardoso studies the ability of insects to blend in with nature and the attention required of spectators if they are to perceive it.





An abstract painting inspired by the landscape of Colombia's central region using desert tones and colors in which the atmosphere produces a feeling of vastness.

The image in Carlos Blanco's most recent piece is comprised of colored paper stuck together (German acid-free paper).



An emblematic piece from Hernandez's body of work featuring a Sign, which together with the harmonious colors, highlights the two-dimensional quality of the canvas.



Work expemplifying the alchemical experimentation with materials, shapes and calligraphy employed by Luna to draw us into mystical experiences. The piece is based on extensive research into things that cannot be explained literally.

Rueda's work uses the four elements (earth, water, air and fire) as raw materials. This piece is a photograph diptych exploring the immensity of water in different areas of Colombia's oceans and rivers, revealing its details and the traces it leaves behind.



Meira's paintings invite spectators to think about landscape as a whole. These color compositions incorporate tiny anonymous characters whose disquieting presence reveals the vastness of the space around them.



The work of Jacanamijoy is based on his memories and visions of the Putumayo jungle. These experiences and memories materialize in abstract expressionistic paintings filled with intense color and brushstrokes.






Lot Nº 23 Sin Título (Untitled) • 2009 78.74" x 40.55" • Graphite on paper USD 3,200 - 4,200



Through an insistence in the language of drawing, and with true poetic feeling, the work of Lina Espinosa reflects on territory and cartography, drawing attention to the ambivalence between the idea of maps as objects of beauty and the political control they represent, the forced abandonment of land, climate change and other concepts.

Grossman's most recent series Books uses diverse digital procedures to construct libraries with books which any art connaiseur should be familiar with. Aside from creating a very attractive visual image, the piece also becomes a concept of cultural reference.

Features from the world's most characteristic skyscrapers, like the Empire State Building, are transferred to the coal and graphite sculptures included in Perez's most recent work.





This is the title piece form the Regressive-Progressive project in which Sanchez transcribed different titles of iconic artworks using Gregg Shorthand. The artist used the resulting shorthand symbols to produce a series of paintings on MDF cut-outs.






These pieces are part of an extensive work by Drews titled Garden referring to the chairs in a daycare center that no longer exists. Each chair has a word related to the teachings of this daycare center and to the process of creating and caring for a garden with plants.

Claudia Hakim is, above all, a weaver of shapes. Her pieces are woven out of uniform metallic parts and leftover objects stamped in a die: tiny steel hoops, geometric pieces such as nuts, bolts and screws used to create beautiful sculptural shapes capable of great impact.
